1.0 INTRODUCTION

This report focuses on the Composite Programme of Action (POA) and District Annual Action Plan for the various programmes and projects that will be implemented within the planned period of 2023 including the responsibilities of the Departments/units involved; within specific time frame. Criteria for selecting projects/programmes in the development plan, Source of funding, Composite Programme of Action and Annual Action plans, Estimated Cost of Implementing Annual Plans and Justification for choice of Annual Action Plan and Location of projects.

1.2 Criteria for selecting the Development Plan

The selection of projects/programmes for implementation within the four (4) quarter of 2023 was based on agreed criteria notably:

- Completion of on-going projects
- ➤ Project which satisfies the immediate needs of people
- Project whose cost could be accommodated within the year
- ➤ Project which will have immediate impact on poverty reduction and good governance.
- Programmes/projects that will address cross- cutting issues such as gender, environment, HIV/AIDs, Social Protection, Local Economic Development, maternal health, vulnerable groups and other pro-poor interventions into the development process.

1.3 Source of Funding

The Central Government funds such as District Assembly Common Fund (DACF) and District Development Facility (DDF) form the main source of funding for the development plans.

Efforts will also be made to source funds from other donors in Ghana and in the District to enhance the plan implementation. The District Assembly's Internally Generated Fund (IGF) is also expected to support some aspects of the plan to facilitate easy access to finances for implementation.

1.4 Composite Programme of Action and Annual Action Plans

The development programmes, projects, cost and time frame for implementation, location and sources of funding are presented in the Programme of Action (POA) as well as the Annual Action Plans for implementation. In the plans, yearly estimated expenditures based on the National Medium-Term Development Plan Framework (NMTDPF) 2022-2025-Dimensional area of:

- ➤ Economic Development
- ➤ Social Development
- ➤ Environment, Infrastructure and Human Settlements
- ➤ Governance, Corruption and Public Accountability
- Emergency planning and response (including covid-19 recovery plan)
- > Implementation, Coordination, Monitoring and Evaluation

1.5 Implementation Factors

The implementation of planned programmes/projects within the four (4) quarters will take into consideration administrative, social, climate, and geological factors. Some of these include:

- ➤ Timely availability of funds and other inputs.
- ➤ Availability of personnel with the necessary technical skills and expertise
- ➤ The seasonal calendar of the activities of rural population, especially farmers

1.6 Estimated Cost of Implementing Composite Annual Action Plans

A summary of the programmes areas, projects and activities as well as the cost and sources of funding are presented in programme of Action and Annual Plans. The yearly estimated expenditures have also been provided according to the six (6) Dimensions. The total cost for implementing the Action Plan for the period 2023 is estimated at Ten Million, Three-six Thousand, five Hundred and ninety-five Ghana Cedis Twelve Pesewas GH¢ (GH¢10,036,595.12). The breakdown under the six-dimensional areas of the NMTDPF 2023 is as follows.

➤ Economic Development - GH¢ 1,777,765.853

➤ Environment, Infrastructure and Human Settlements - GH¢2,211,562.00

➤ Governance, Corruption and Public Accountability - GH¢1,833,949.00

➤ Social Development - GH¢1,227,339.22

➤ Implementation, Co-ordination and Monitoring Accountability - GH¢ 1,635,267.00

Emergency planning and response (including covid-19 recovery plan)

- GH¢1.380, 712, 047.00

Total = $GH \notin 10,036,595.12$

1.7 Justification for choice of Annual Action Plan and Location of projects

The specific location of projects is based on the following projects:

- ➤ Needy or deprived areas in terms of socio-economic infrastructure and services, accessibility and spatial/economic intention.
- ➤ Access to deprived areas where the production of agro-based raw material, food crops and export crops can be improved
- ➤ Emergencies such as disaster, disease outbreak, conflict etc.
- ➤ Area with the necessary threshold population. Notwithstanding this, some deprived areas are supported.
- ➤ Communities with a proven capacity for self-help and local initiative

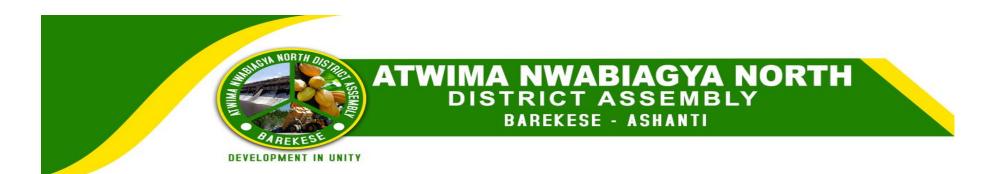
